SET AMIDST THE PINK HUES OF JAIPUR, the craft capital of India, House of Fanusta is a concept home and living store that caters to everything a home may require— from furniture to décor and lighting. Coated in the luminous hues of ochre with cooling limestone to combat the scorching desert sun, it draws its influence from the imposing forts and palaces of the region.

WE LOVED THE IMPRESSIVE 12,000 sq ft four-storeyed premises with its exquisitely hand-painted turquoise doors and windows that illuminate the interiors. Categorically segregated, each floor has something unique to offer and is enhanced with distinctive folk paintings and opulent fixtures on the walls.

THE GROUND FLOOR OFFERS AN EXCLUSIVE RANGE OF House of Fanusta signature lines, flanked by a bright expanse of airy windows and a quaint arched room. Each artefact is designed and crafted by master artisans. The adorned materials in a muted palette are flawlessly balanced, to create sheer elegance and sophistication.

WE WERE IMPRESSED BY THE INTERESTING COLLECTION of art on this floor, including works of shilp guru Birdhichand, National Awardee Mobin Hussain, Lyla Freechild and others. Step down towards the basement, and you reach a tranquil expanse of kitchen and dining, with large airy windows that allow the outside light to filter in. This floor displays handmade crockery, modular kitchens and dining furniture. The ceramic dinnerware adds sustainability to the kitchen range while the linens, dispensers and decoratives slot in the craft element. Each display, complete with exclusive furniture, statement kitchenware and stunning art pieces, creates an experience that elevate one's taste and expectations.



TAKE THE STAIRWAY TO reach the first floor, a luxurious space of home furniture and furnishings. The ceiling is made of jute rope strands and wooden columns which gives an organic feel to the ambience. This space exudes a colonial charm that complements the eclectic mix of a craft-centric living room and bedroom furniture, bed linen, pouffes, throws and decor items, each having a story to tell of its own.
